Our committee met again on Tuesday, November 11 at the Taqueria Guadalajara in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenue. We plan to meet there again on Tuesday, December 1 at 6 p.m. to carry on our work. There was a really small group gathered so we mostly ate dinner and had fun. I will go ahead and report on a few things going on around here.

I wrote the boys at the News Tribune and asked if they would be interested in doing an article for the Senior Scene or the Adventure Section. I said we had a very good program running from Monday thru Thursday where seniors, underemployed and layabouts could come out and ride.

Members of TWBC continue to be involved with the creation of Tacoma's new Mobility Plan. We will have actually met this past month to draw bike routes on the City's map base.

Ralph got a mostly negative response when he went in to Steilacoom to talk about the Railroad tracks near ABITIBI's mill. It seems the City is saying the tracks belong to ABITIBI so they can't do much more. I have asked Ralph to provide some more thought on covering the tracks with asphalt in a way where cars can continue to speed thru the area.

Since I listened to Tim Payne's talk at the Forevergreen Fifth Annual Trail Conference (where were you?) last month, I discovered your chance of getting killed is about 85 percent if a car hits you at 40 mph and about 5 to 15 percent if you are hit at 20 mph. So, when I fall down on the tracks and a car runs over me, wouldn't it be better if the car was going 20 mph? I'm sorry you all missed the Trail Conference. About 65 people had a good meal and learned alot of stuff about regional trail planning and the role of biking and walking in our future throughout the Puget Sound area.

The Bicycle Alliance of Washington Legislative Committee is alive and well and in the process of drafting up a plan of action for the next session down in Olympia. I have accepted their request to serve as your representative and Ralph is also there representing the BAW.

People continue to ask if the connection between the Puyallup Riverwalk and Foothills Trail will ever get done. This connection is mired in government red tape that shouldn't really be an issue. Why don't we have a short piece of temporary pavement under the two bridges so a person can get away from riding on East Pioneer? If you live in Puyallup, please keep complaining about this critical missing link.

You should be aware that SR509 will be messed up with bridge rebuilding work for a long time. SR509 was used as a

good way to get out of downtown Tacoma up to NE Tacoma, Federal Way and the Auburn Valley. Please find alternatives to this route, as you don't want to be near the bridge construction. My understanding is the four-lane freeway with great bike lanes has been reduced to a two-lane road. Please stay away or drive there in your car and check it out.

Scott has been working with Lakewood to help them get their new Sharrows properly installed on their roads. Scott feels like the Sharrows should be more in the middle of the travel lanes rather than near the edges so it looks like a bike lane instead of a Sharrow. Good work, Scott. A Sharrow is a road symbol that tells the car drivers that cyclists should be expected on the road and you should share with the cyclist.

I have learned there may be a lawsuit from an injured cyclist who claims the Pierce County Bike Map put him on a road where he was injured. I know this sounds silly, but Pierce County may decide to cancel bike maps if the injured cyclist wins his case.

The Tacoma City Council is set to approve a Complete Streets Resolution that is part of their planning for rebuilding Tacoma's traditional mixed-use centers. This action will be great news, as Complete Streets and the new Mobility Plan should provide the base plan for moving forward with a truly connected network of bike facilities and arterial sidewalks.

Here is some news you can use regarding the future when gasoline gets to \$6 per gallon. I heard on the radio that Best Buy is going to be selling Electric Bikes in the very near future. I hope you all stay dry and warm this month. Please sign up for our annual banquet coming to town on January 30.

Bike Resources Online

Technical help on the internet has improved incredibly since I launched my bike-repair website at **www.JimLangley.net** 10 years ago.

RoadBikeRider.com is among the advancements. RBR's public site and **Premium Site** have many pages of information in Q&A format written by shop owner **Alan "Uncle Al" Ardizone** and yours truly. And in addition to writing this weekly column, I moderate 2 technical forums in the *Roadie Rap* area of the *Premium Site*. Members will find hundreds of posts on tech topics.

Today I'll point out some useful sites worth visiting and bookmarking. Don't forget, though, that a good bike shop is your best resource for tech help. The personnel works daily with the latest bikes and equipment, receives manufacturers' training and gets their tech bulletins. Plus, shop guys can inspect and ride your bike to analyze a problem in a way no online guru ever can.

Many manufacturers provide technical pages on their sites. Here are 6 additional online resources that I think you'll like a lot:

www.SheldonBrown.com

The late **Sheldon Brown** created a truly encyclopedic website where you'll find lots of informative articles (and funny ones too). Whether you're trying to figure out tire sizing, gearing, the difference between freewheels and cassettes or what type of lighting system to buy, Sheldon's site can help. Note that the site is affiliated with Harris Cyclery in West Newton, Massachusetts, the bike shop Sheldon worked for. While surfing you will sometimes end up in the shop's catalog. But that's a good thing because it's a source for hard-to-find components and parts you might need.

Former bike mechanic **Alex Ramon**'s website is one of my favorites because it's video-based. Along with great how-to repair and maintenance clips you'll find written step-by-step instructions and materials lists. There are also help forums and live chats.

Park makes every bicycle tool under the sun but maybe you don't realize that the website also tells you how to use them. Credit goes to Park employee and pro race mechanic **Calvin Jones**. He writes for home and shop mechanics alike so there are even advanced instructions.

Tip: There's more fun stuff in *Calvin's Corner*, where he talks about his wrenching at races and other events.

This is the place if you enjoy crunching numbers like drag coefficients, wheel inertia, optimal seat height and crankarm length, and other facets of cycling physics and performance.

Tip: Last time I talked with owner **Ron Sutphin**, I learned that many of his students have no interest in becoming pro mechanics. They just want to learn how to work on their own bikes or build a frame. Attending United Bicycle Institute might be a fun way to spend a vacation.
