Actions affecting you and your community





Our committee met again on Tuesday, July 6 at the Harvester Restaurant in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenues. We plan to meet there again on Tuesday, August 3 at about 6 pm to carry out our important work and keep up with current activities.

Ralph reported that Steve Gorcester would be leaving the State's Transportation Improvement Board for hopefully, greener pastures and smoother roads. Steve served for many years as the Executive Director of this important State Board. Many of our new bike lanes, sidewalks and trail spurs are the result of Steve's efforts to make sure the Board funded projects accommodated all modes of travel. In the past, Steve worked in putting together the first Pierce County Non-motorized Transportation Plan.

Ralph and I talked about the importance of having a County bike map, directional signage and continued effort on building our trail system, bike lanes, fog lane shoulders and sidewalks. Ralph offered to write the current County Council members to remind them of the need to provide a viable non-motorized transportation system.

I met with T.J. Nedrow this month. T.J. does the non-motorized work for District 9 of WSDOT. He also is charged with overseeing the Park and Ride lots. T.J. let me know that the Thurston County Parks Department was recently absorbed into the Public Works Department, apparently as a way to save administrative costs. I told T.J. about the recent bike accident where the cyclist's attorney claimed the County Bike map directed the cyclist onto an unsafe road because the fog line shoulder had a non-standard storm sewer grate that contributed to an accident.

Ralph and I had also talked about the importance of filling our vacant President, Ride Captain and Special Event Manager positions. Thankfully, we appear to have a good candidate for President and for Ride Captain. We still need a Special Event Manager and several other volunteer positions filled.

During the month, I led a ride around the perimeter of Tacoma, University Place, Steilacoom and Parkland. I wrote the City to let them know the sidewalk on Schuster Parkway needs vegetative maintenance, sidewalk repair and a plan to widen the sidewalk where possible.

I also did some mental study to verify that trails are competitive with large transportation projects for motorized vehicles. Most of our proposed large projects in the region come in with a capital cost of around \$50,000 per daily user. I found that trails cost about the same or less. A sidewalk might only cost about \$5,000 per daily user. Of course, using the existing system costs hardly anything.

On July 14, interested parties like Forevergreen and Foothills came together to discuss the future of Pierce County Parks and the Sprinker Ice Arena problem. There are ideas floating around where the parks might become a Metro Parks District similar to Tacoma's Metro Parks District. We want trail development to be included in the park's mission, but we can also envision the trail function being absorbed into Public Works similar to what recently happened in Thurston County. We also recently learned that Fife, Edgewood, Milton and Sumner recently formed a joint venture to apply for a large Federal grant to complete their Interurban Trail.
