TWBC, originally established in 1888 & reinvigorated in 1974, is a general purpose bicycling club in Pierce County that welcomes cyclists of all skill levels for social riding. The COG is issued monthly.

RedSpoke 2011

After riding the Courage Classic for many years I decided to try a different multi-day ride; I am glad I did. The RedSpoke is a five-day charity ride from Redmond to Spokane sponsored by the Redmond Rotary. The ride started with a large catered breakfast in the Redmond Marriott where you meet the other riders and get your first goodie package. Redmond's mayor spoke at the breakfast and informed us that this was the rider's vacation and it is the RedSpoke's staff mission to show us a good time. That they did.

The fully-supported ride is limited to 100 participants with options for indoor camping, regular tent camping and a few motels. With the limited participants I had no trouble getting good camping sites. The first day goes about 60 miles from Redmond to Skykomish, not a real easy 60. You soon learn that the staff really means that they want you to enjoy the ride and your vacation. Rest stops were frequent and well supplied. At the end of the first day setting up camp Papa Murphy's came out to provide pizza for all the riders. There were four coolers with various drinks, and tables of snack foods including healthy options (but no ice cream). No this was not dinner, which was served a short walk away, and included a talk by the Skykomish mayor.

Redspoke basically follows US-2. Daily destinations and mileage are; Redmond to Skykomish (60 miles); over Stevens Pass past Wenatchee to Lincoln Rock State Park (80 miles); over Orondo grade to Coulee City (60 miles); to Davenport with 3 options (60, 80 or 100 miles); and finally 40 miles into Spokane. On the last day all the riders wear their RedSpoke jersey and gather prior to entering Spokane so that they all ride into Riverfront Park en mass – quite a sight.

RedSpoke will celebrate it's 25th Anniversary, so they are planning special things. Costs are \$75 to register and each individual must raise \$600 in charitable donations. You can purchase a bus ride back to Redmond for \$75 which was a good deal. If you are a member of a team, charitable contributions drop to \$500 – so my plan is to get a TWBC Team to enter next year. Hope you can join me, it will be fun.
