Heaven to Hell (Canyon that is) and Back

One of the great joys of organized cycling is touring with a group. During the first two weeks of October, ten Members of the Wheelmen lead by Carol and Roz Davis toured the beautiful and varied terrain of Northeast Oregon. We started in La Grande, headed east through Enterprise and Joseph, turned south over the Wallowa Mountains, jet boated down the Snake River before completing the circle back to La Grande. Eight days to bike, to enjoy the scenery, and to leisurely enjoy time with good company.

On our first day we left the big city of 13,000 behind and climbed steadily past the town of Elgin before enjoying miles and miles paralleling the beautiful Wallowa River. If there was any doubt we had left the city for good, all doubts were put to rest when we were stopped by a cattle drive. The cattle were being moved across the road from one pasture to another, but the steers were not sure it was a good idea. Consequently, the rancher would get them part way off the road only to have the herd turn back at the last moment. For a city dweller, it was an interesting process. For the country drivers we spoke with, it was an all too often occurrence. And for a bike rider, it was good thing we had fenders riding across pavement recently vacated by nervous cattle.

October weather in the northwest is varied and unpredictable. The first day had been filled with blue sky and warm temperatures, but as we approached the Wallowa Mountains, the temperature dropped and the treat of rain or even snow became very real. We were prepared to deal with riding in the rain, but snow is dangerous on skinny tires. With a minivan filled with equipment, the sag wagon could not get all of the riders over the mountains if it was

WSDOT Ferry Bike Program Policy Update

The new ferry fares (all routes) that the Washington State Transportation Commission adopted (effective Aug., 2011) included changes for bicycle customers. The annual bicycle permits have been eliminated. The current bicycle surcharge will now be collected on all routes on commuters (bicycle riders) paying the applicable single trip fair. Luckily, the bicycle surcharge will not be increased for now.

Adventure Cycling Adventures

Adventure Cycling has 56 bike tours on their 2012 slate. There are supported trips or self-contained ones. Trips vary from week to month(s) long, on the road or on dirt/trail, & include family fun tours.

There are seven new tours throughout the U.S., including the Finger Lakes Region of New York, Cape Cod of Massachusetts, Outer Banks of North Carolina, Big Bend of Texas, The Sierra Cascades from Mexico to Canada, & here in our own backyard, the San Juan Islands. Also included are a Vermont Inn-to-Inn tour to take in the fall foliage, & a new Leadership Training Course in Florida to absorb knowledge along with the sun.

Nine existing tours have been revised and refreshed. These include Glacier-Waterton Loop (Whitefish, Montana to British Columbia), the Denali Adventure (Alaska), Blue Ridge Bliss (Front Royal, Virginia), the Family Fun Colorado (Silverthorne), a Northern tier van-supported tour (coast to coast), a California's Wine Country (Sausalito), The Great Divide Mountain Bike Route - Cycle the Great Divide (Montana), the Great Divide Canada (from Whitefish), and Cycle Washington (from Redmond).

Family tour emphasis can be found with the Family Fun Colorado tour (Silverthorne), the KATY Trail (St. Charles, Missouri) or the C & O Canal (Arlington, Virginia).

National Forests & Parks can be explored on the Red Rock Ramble through Bryce and Zion Canyons (Utah), the Blue Ridge Bliss through Shenandoah and Great Smoky Mountain National Park (Virginia), the Glacier-Waterton Loop (Montana), and a Grand Canyon trip (with two departure dates). Coastal explorations include the Atlantic Coast Tour (Bar Harbor, Maine to Key West, Florida), the Cape Cod Pilgrimage (Plymouth, Massachusetts), and the Outer Banks Tour (Elizabeth City, North Carolina).
