Actions affecting you and your community

Our committee met again on Tuesday, September 4, at the Harvester Restaurant in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenues. The next meeting will be on Tuesday, October 2 at 6pm. We were joined for awhile by Josh Jorgensen and Westin Norwood. Josh has a temporary job with the City of Tacoma to work on non-motorized transportation matters. He was asking for help to recruit volunteers for the annual bike count conducted thruout the Puget Sound region. This year's counting is on September 25, 26 and 27 and is meant to measure bicycle commuter traffic.

- 1. Trail Bollards. I was happy to report I had paged thru the new American Association of State Highway and Transportation Offical's (Aashto) Guide for the Development of Bicycle Facilities. On trails, bollards are now strongly discouraged. Even a single bollard is discouraged. The Guide also recommends protective fences/barriers when trails parallel water hazards and steeper slopes.
- 2. PROS. The County's Park, Recreation and Open Space Plan has been talked about recently. Ralph Wessels worked on the last committee that produced the County Plan. I indicated I used the plan in my comments to the County Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Flood Control Plan. The response to my questions indicated the Flood Control Officials are aware that the proposed Set Back Levee on the lower Puyallup River needs to accommodate the trail listed in the PROS plan. The trail will run from the Melroy Bridge downstream to Tacoma's City limits. Several Foothills and Forevergreen members will be attending the County Council Committee meeting where the Flood Control Plan is presented. We want the County Council to be aware of the trail plan and the need to accommodate the trail on the relocated levee.

Ralph also said it has been over three years since the PROS plan was produced and the County still has no financing scheme for building trails. Jane Moore said the Forevergreen Council continues to work with the County on finding financing. The County is considering forming Park Districts to raise money. Ralph reminded us that Olympia/Thurston County voted in a Utility Tax dedicated to raising money for sidewalks and bicycle amenities.

- 3. Prairie Line Trail. Jane Moore is on the 20+ member committee considering the development of the trail near UWT. They are meeting next week to discuss three alternatives for crossing South 21st Street. This is a steep street that dives down from Market/Jefferson, meets Pacific Avenue and crosses onto State Road 509. The City seems to be concerned about moving cars, but still having a safe crossing for pedestrians.
- 4. Fort Lewis Hazard. Ralph is finishing a letter to Fort Lewis Officials advising them of the very dangerous, inadequate intersection of Steilacoom-DuPont Road and North Gate Road. Fort Lewis hired a design-build outfit to improve? the intersection. It is now a potential death trap for cyclists and walkers as concrete curbs occupy the fog line shoulders and there is no shoulder on a curve connecting the two roads.


