What Do You Mean No Raincoat?

No raincoat, no booties, no finger gloves? How about arm and leg warmers? What kind of riding is this? Well, during our spring ride to Sacramento, we hit a heat wave! A group of seven including Sue Coley (our leader), Peggy Fjetland, Joyce Clifford, Caroline Warnock, Carla Gramlich, Christy Strand and Jill Priest from the West Sound Cycling Club met up in Sacramento for a week of riding. We were joined by Steve and Phyllis Lay and Phil Burgess who wanted to get some riding in on their way to New Orleans for a big ride to the north across the Atlantic States. Rode for six days, from April 18th - 23rd, 2012.

The Sacramento Valley is as FLAT as a pancake. Our only hills were riding from the valley to the top of a dike and from a dike back to the valley floor, and riding up and over overpasses over freeways. The scenery was fabulous. We rode through many small towns, some of which were located at an elevation of 13 feet above sea level. Did I say flat?

We stayed at the Sacramento Hostel and rode out and back rides each day. We rode to Davis and rode around the UC Davis campus. We rode the islands of the Sacramento Delta. This was my favorite ride. Large islands surrounded with roads on dikes and farmland inside the dikes. It seemed like we were riding in "the land that time forgot", lots of ghost towns and very few people. Water everywhere. We saw a sea lion that seemed out of place so far from the salt water. Lots of egrets, geese and raptors.

We rode to Clarksburg and visited an old sugar mill that had been converted to a "wine center" that featured 7 or 8 local wineries. Wonderful wine. This was the day we were able to avoid an armed carjacker who had hijacked two cars and a tractor on a wild spree as he was evading the police. Both I-5 and 80 were shut down for several hours. We were told that he might have headed in our direction on one of the dike roads and to watch out for anyone in a brown Ford F-250!

Rode to the Cycle Gladiator Winery. Fifty-six miles, ninety-three degrees! Toooo hot! Not our best day. But, no rain gear!

Next to the river, through wetlands and through open space and parks. Saw lots of wild turkeys and egrets and one turtle. And there were snakes!

Actions affecting you and your community

Our committee met again on Tuesday, May 1, at the Harvester Restaurant in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenues. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 5 at 6pm. I hope you have been riding your bike a lot this past Bike Month and will continue thru our ideal summer season. As always, when you see things that need improvement near your home town, please take the time to get involved with your local government. Our small committee can't begin to make our local area better without your help and involvement.

- 1. Forevergreen Map. Kirk Kirkland and I and others have met to update the Forevergreen Trails Map which shows our existing trails and our planned and hoped for future regional trails. I'm thinking the map will be revised in time for the Forevergreen Trails annual meeting. Many of you are aware that Forevergreen has members from our bike club, the Foothills Trails Coalition, local government officials and elected officials all meeting and working together to get trails built thruout Pierce County.
- 2. North Gate Road. This road connects with the Steilacoom-DuPont Road and both are important bicycle routes. Unfortunately, the Army has built a raised concrete island and some curbing at the intersection that is a very severe hazard to cyclists. The island and some curbing extend into the fog line shoulder where we place our bikes when riding. A cyclist has to move into the traffic lane to get past the obstacle and we are concerned it is an accident waiting to happen. Both Ralph and I are trying to contact the Army Traffic Engineers to voice our concerns. We have already asked the County to take action since the road is jointly operated by the County and the Army.
- 3. Transportation Choices Coalition. We received word that our local representative, Andrew Austin, will be leaving Transportation Choices and heading up a new national organization in Washington DC that will be promoting transit and other forms of alternative transportation. It has been a great pleasure working with Andrew these past few years.
- 4. Pierce County Flood Control Plan. The Planning Commission met this month to review and take further comment on the plan. Both Foothills and TWBC has commented on the Environmental Impact Statement where we ask the flood control agency to build the trail from Puyallup towards Tacoma on their future rebuilt North Levee along the Puyallup River.
- 5. Pierce County Parks. The Foothills Rails to Trails Coalition had their monthly meeting and Pierce County Parks hosted the meeting. Apparently, it will be some years before the connection is made between Buckley and South Prairie, perhaps between 2016 and 2020. It is a very disturbing situation.

- 6. Cushman Powerline Trail . On a more positive note, the Request for Proposal is out for design services to design the extension to Borgen Boulevard. PenMet Parks received a State RCO grant to extend the trail.
- 7. Oregon Active Transportation Conference. Jane Moore reported on her trip and findings. She will have also given a brief report at our May General Membership Meeting. Jane said there were about 250 like minded people at the conference.
- 8. Community Transformation Grant. The Health Department is gearing up to start their efforts to transform the general health and well being in our County. Active transportation and cycling will be a big part of their efforts.
- 9. Bicycle Magazine. We briefly discussed the excellent articles in this month's magazine particularly with regard to efforts to get more kids walking and riding their bikes to school.
- 10. Bicycle Alliance of Washington. Ralph reported that Barb Culp wants to retire from her Executive Director job at BAW, so here is a job opportunity for someone. He also mentioned BAW is thinking of changing their name. We didn't think much of their suggested "Washington Bikes" and are indicating our displeasure with a name change.

By the time you read this, I will have returned from a week long trip in Bishop, CA trying to ride some Killer Climbs of the Eastern Sierra. See Nomints.com for details. I may have mostly sat in my beach chair. I hope to see you on the PMC this year.
