Actions affecting you and your community

Our committee met again on Tuesday, August 8, at the Harvester Restaurant in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenues. The next meeting will be on Tuesday, September 4 at 6pm. As I've said many times before, we have over 30 government entities that we could be working with. So, please take a personal interest in alternative transportation in your community; the planet and TWBC will appreciate your efforts.

- 1. Foothills Trail to Mt. Rainier. Several TWBC Members participate in the annual Rainier to Ruston run/walk event. It was started by TWBC member John Selby to showcase the possible future trail running from the Carbon River entrance to Ruston. The Foothills Rails to Trails Coalition has made purchase offers for the old rail corridor running from Carbonado up the river towards the park entrance. The Burlington Northern RR has not been willing to sell it's possible interest to Foothills Rails to Trails Coalition, so the Parks Department has been asked to try to obtain the right of way. Our dream is to be able to access Mt. Rainier Park by trail from Tacoma.
- 2. Pierce County Trails Conference. The Forevergreen Coalition will have the annual Trails Conference on September 18 at the Pierce County Environmental Services Building in University Place.
- 3. Washington State Trails Conference. The Washington State Trails Coalition will have its annual conference on October 25 to 28 at the Hilton Hotel in Vancouver Washington. This year's theme is "Bridging Communities with Trails". Registration and the program is available online at www.washingtonstatetrailscoalition.org.
- 4. University Place Trails. I received information that University Place has obtained the missing properties for its Leach Creek Trail proposal. Their dream is to have a soft surface trail extending down thru Chamber's Creek. It is also hoped to have a trail connection between Phillip's Road in Lakewood to Chamber's Creek Road West across Chamber's Creek. This trail connection would follow the old wagon road that was used before Bridgeport Way was built many years ago.
- 5. Expand Light Link. Several TWBC Members will have attended meetings in late August to explore ideas of expanding Tacoma's Light Link streetcar line.
- 6. Click It or Ticket. There is still interest in getting law enforcement to enforce mandatory helmet laws when a cyclist might be stopped for some other traffic infraction.
- 7. Missing Sidewalk on Shuster Parkway. Steve Brown reported a portion of the sidewalk on Shuster Parkway near downtown Tacoma has been replaced with a short section of crushed gravel. He said it is quite ridable, similar to the paths in Wright Park.
- 8. Sumner Trails. New trail is being extended to the north towards Stewart Avenue. It includes a rather grand new bridge. The main bridge structure was placed across the White River in August and the contractor is now building some major approaches as the bridge is high above the river. The work can be seen from the Sumner Golf Course, but the easy way is to find the northerly end of the existing trail on the weekend and walking less than 300 feet to the work site. So, the trail ends on 16th Street East along the river and the new trail construction is headed north to Stewart Avenue (8th Street East)

It was sad to read about the death of a local cyclist on the RamRod. Steve Albers was the owner of a local insurance agency and was very much involved in supporting our Tacoma community. Apparently, he was an accomplished mountaineer having climbed Mt. Rainier many times and our other big mountains. He had become an active cyclist the last few years. His

accident happened in the Box Canyon area on the descent from the Paradise area. We haven't heard any further details other than he crashed while he was alone on the road. So, please check the fit of your helmet and make sure you can only get one finger between the chin strap and your chin. If you have a blowout at high speed, take time to figure out which tire is flat and gently brake on your good tire. •


