Actions affecting you and your community

Our committee just had a short, brief meeting on an odd day, Monday, September 2, Labor day, due to some travel issues. We continue to meet in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenues at the Harvester Restaurant. We recently learned the same person owns the Powerhouse in Puyallup, Knapps and several other places in Tacoma. The next meeting is scheduled to be on Tuesday, October 1 at 6pm. As you know, we have over 30 governmental entities that we could be working with. We are grateful for the work of our partners, the Foothills Rails to Trails Coalition and ForeverGreen Trails. ForeverGreen will soon be announcing the annual trail meeting to be held in October. As always, please take a personal interest in alternative transportation in your community. Biking will improve your personal health and the health of our planet.

John Ernest Berry III, I and Blake Trask from Bicycle Alliance of Washington will be meeting with John's Puyallup area State legislative representatives, Senator Bruce Dammier and Representative Hans Zeiger on Tuesday, October 8. Our main message will be asking for their support with RCO grants when Pierce County Parks finally gets their right of way acquired for the final piece of the main spur Foothills Trail, South Prairie to Buckley. We will also ask their support for extending the John Wayne Trail across the Columbia River and their support for people with disabilities.

On September 26, the Washington Coalition for Promoting Physical Activity will be meeting at the NorPoint Center in North East Tacoma all day. Liza Quinn from Feet First and Blake Trask from Bicycle Alliance of Washington will be presenting and Jane Moore will be leading the meeting. I've asked Steve Brown to attend on my behalf as I will be in Idaho.

Steve, John Selby and I will have traveled to Wenatchee on September 13 to attend a meeting of the Washington State Trails Coalition. This group puts on the semi annual trails meeting and it will be in Bellingham next year. We will be continuing to lobby for the cross state trail, particularly extending the John Wayne Trail across the Columbia River to the east.

Stadium Way is now open for your biking and walking pleasure with new bike lanes, smooth pavement and wide sidewalks overlooking Puget Sound. I presume you may still find it difficult to go from Pacific Avenue to Stadium Way and to cross the freeway traffic merging onto Stadium Way.

I'm pleased to report Puyallup seems to be moving rapidly ahead to build the JEB III Way spur from Shaw Road to 134th Avenue East to provide easier access to the Foothills Trail. This project was held up by certain activists and officials who wanted the spur to be on private property on the north side of the rail road tracks. The private owner wasn't cooperative, so the trail will be where it should have been all along. It could have been built years ago, if Puyallup had recognized the need, but it required efforts to convince Puyallup it was necessary. Now, we are asking for Sharrows to be installed on Pioneer Way East and maybe bike lanes in the future if a travel lane can be removed.

Puyallup is still trying to figure out how to connect the Foothills Trail to the Riverwalk Trail. It was thought to be possible to place the trail on new Puget Sound Energy powerline right of way, but apparently that idea isn't working out. Puyallup just voted to change the zoning next to 134th Avenue East so we may be seeing some commercial businesses and warehouses on the Daffodil fields. The easy way would be for major landowner Knutson to allow temporary trail to get from the Riverwalk up to 134th Avenue East. The Official interim way will be to cross over Shaw Road on the western side to the new JEB III Way.

I have been riding a lot this summer and hope that October will be dry and nice around here. In November, I get to ride for 12 days from Phoenix to the Border. There is one or more good event rides this fall. I have always liked the Manastash Metric out of Ellensburg on October 5, a doable one day drive and just a metric century, but it is famous for having some challenging head winds.
