Actions affecting you and your community .....

Our committee met again on Tuesday, July 2 at the Harvester Restaurant in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenues. The next two meetings will be on a different date due to conflicts. In August, we will meet on the first Monday. In September, we will also meet the first Monday, Labor Day. As I have said many times there are over 30 government entities that we could be working with and I have a suggestion below under State of our Trails.

- 1. Eatonville's Bud Blanchard Trail. The Town has not been able to move forward with construction this spring since the Town spent the \$300,000 or so in donated funds for general operations due to the depression. The Town is restoring the donation in an installment method so there may be risk of losing State matching funds. I will be talking with Eatonville's Administration regarding this matter.
- 2. State Legislature. Ralph reported the Legislature did a poor job regarding funding important transportation projects including non-motorized needs. A 10 cent gas tax proposal didn't get very far.
- 3. John Wayne Trail. I have begun a process of asking King County's Park operation and Bicycle Alliance of Washington to lobby Seattle Water to open a trail connection thru a small corner of their Cedar River Watershed. It may be possible to connect the Cedar River Trail to Rattlesnake Lake and the John Wayne Trail over Snoqualmie Pass. Both Tacoma and Seattle are under new orders from EPA to upgrade their water treatment. Tacoma is filtering the Green River and Seattle has decided to use just ultra violet light treatment.
- 4. Transportation Commission. Both Jane Moore and I have applied to be members of Tacoma's new Transportation Commission. I also applied to be on Tacoma's Sustainability Commission.
- 5. Bollards. Ralph reported some bollards on the Foothills Trail may not meet current standards that require a diamond shaped stripe around the bollard along with stripes that extend out in the path of travel. I investigated and found this defect to be in Orting on the special marking that TWBC helped pay for to enhance safety.
- 6. Puyallup. There has been very little progress in getting the JEB Thruway constructed between Shaw Road and 134th Street. Likewise, on 134th Street towards the Riverwalk, there has been very little progress. I have hoped Puyallup might lay down Sharrows on Pioneer Ave from downtown to the Meeker Trailhead. Puyallup also has the future capacity of removing a travel lane and installing bike lanes or a cycletrack along Pioneer.
- 7. State of our Trail Development. I am a member of both Foothills Rails to Trails Coalition and the Forevergreen Trails Council. There is very great concern that trail acquisition and construction is not moving forward in Pierce County. Foothills mission is to see trail construction thruout our County, but their focus is very oriented to the Puyallup Valley and there is limited staff available to lobby for trails. Forevergreen is also interested in providing trails thruout Pierce County and it is a forum of government officials, government workers and trail advocates. Forevergreen has a paid Executive Director who works a very limited amount of time due to budget constraints. There is not much funding available for trails and Pierce County must rely on grants to get the Foothills Trail built from South Prairie to Buckley.

I intend to try to bring Foothills and Forevergreen and TWBC closer together with a more common voice and effort. I am hoping that TWBC will provide more financial support to Forevergreen and Foothills will also provide support to show a common voice and effort.

With regard to Pierce County trails, I hope the Public Works Department will become much more involved in developing trails particularly in South Hill Puyallup. I hope they will understand that trails are very much transportation projects. For example, in Tacoma the Public Works department is building the trail infrastructure. There are almost 300 miles of possible trails in Pierce County, a huge amount. So, it will be necessary to step back and decide where to concentrate our efforts on trail development. Additionally, we will need to acquire the right of ways and build soft surface trails for the time being with hard surface to come later in better times.

As I mentioned there are over 30 government entities we should be working with, so I hope we can be successful in bringing TWBC, Foothills and Forevergreen closer together with common voice and effort.

Please ride your bike. It is good for you and the environment. Ride more and worry less. ①
